


















Founder's Desk

Aishwariam Social Welfare Organisation and Resource Training Centre (ASWO) was started on 30th August 2006 with a view to uplift rural youth and women including the vulnerable, downtrodden and disadvantaged community. ASWO reaches out through its dedicated Social Workers and Volunteers by providing Employability Trainings to the rural and urban population.

The committed Service of ASWO in and around Coimbatore, Tirupur, Nilgiris and Chennai Districts of TamilNadu has brought in tremendous appreciation from the Local officials, Corporates, Banks and the Community at large. The Organisation operates, covering programmes in the thematic areas such as Care and Support for people infected and affected by HIV/AIDS, TB, Empowerment of vulnerable and downtrodden women through skill training and capacity building, Disability Inclusion, Education, Livelihood Promotion and Health Programmes.

Medical Support for Child



The Organisation extended medical support to a three-and-a-half-year-old child who was down with 'Mild Intellectual disability with autistic spectrum disorder' where the child was recommended for Occupational Therapy. The Child's mother who was deserted by her husband sought our help to meet out the everyday therapy expenses for the child. The Organisation supported the child's therapy expenses.

PLHA

The Organisation strives hard to provide the best of services to the PLHAs and their families. To enhance the health conditions of People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLHAs), our organisation is committed to providing monthly nutrition food supplies. We also offer counselling and motivational sessions to support their mental health needs, alongside ongoing physical health support through nutrition programmes. Our goal is to empower PLHAs to become self-confident, self-reliant, and sustainable individuals. Moreover, we strive to raise awareness about environmental issues and work towards reducing the stigma and discrimination faced by PLHAs in our society.

The Organisation has always been gracious and compassionate about the children of PLHAs, these children are given all liberty to choose courses offered by the Organisation at free of cost. The Organisation also supports the PLHAs to take up Income-generation programmes and courses for their benefit and well-being.





HOPE Project

Livelihood Support

The Organisation has a track record of providing Livelihood support to the vulnerable and underprivileged community, especially women. A woman from a disadvantaged background sought help to support her family for livelihood. Her husband stays home since one of his legs was amputated due to diabetes. She is the sole bread winner of the family. She is a goat grazer who already has few goats and had been making their living out of that. She requested the Organisation to support her with few more goats so that she can make both ends meet. The Organisation sponsored her with 3 goat kids which added to her herd.









DRIVE Project

Anganwadi

Yet another initiative of the Organisation was 'Refurbishment of Anganwadi Centres' in the operational areas of Aishwariam. As a preview to that, based on a survey conducted by the Organisation, utility kits were distributed to the kids of the Anganwadi centre in Thoppampatti. Along with the kits, sleeping mats, plates and tumblers were also given to the kids. The Anganwadi centres need a total revamp in terms of furniture, toys and kids play area with a variety of outdoor play materials. The kids were vibrant and enthusiastic and these kids are the future of our Nation, hence it is important to make their growing stages colourful and enjoyable. Around 30 kids benefitted from this programme.









KUDUM, BHA SHREE - SHG/JLG

ASWO started this Kudumbha Shree Project with a view to eradicating absolute poverty through concerted community action, by facilitating organization of the poor for combining self-help with demand-led convergence of available services and resources to tackle the multiple dimensions and manifestations of poverty, holistically,

The Organisation identifies the potential women self-help group and with the help of Union Bank loans are processed based on their CIBIL scores and repaying capacity. The women take loans to start home based business such as Tailoring, Aari work, Embroidery etc. This year there were 10 JLG groups which comprises of 50 women and a sum of Rs. 27,50,000 was distributed as loan and 5 SHG groups which comprises of 60 women and a sum of Rs.43,50,000 was distributed. Each woman is doing very well and are earning a good income to look after their families and help their children pursue higher studies in colleges.





VAZHIKAATUTHAL

Anti-drug





The abuse of alcohol and illicit drugs continues to be a major threat globally. Prevention of substance abuse among adolescents requires awareness of characteristics that places them at health risk factors. These adolescents are influenced by peer groups and biological/inherent predisposition towards drug addiction. As a result, these adolescents face behavioural change, health issues, mental illness and family discord, this can lead to criminal or anti-social behaviour, and long-term personality changes.

As change makers in the society, ASWO organised awareness programmes at Idigarai Government schools for both boys and girls through Audio Visual Aids. Video clips pertaining to the Evil effects of drug abuse was played. Around 250 adolescent boys benefited from the programme. It is the sole responsibility of every individual to combat against this deadly crime and create a drug free society.

Diabetic & Generic Medicine Awareness Programme

Diabetes poses the greatest threat in today's world. Around 80% of the general public are aware of the killer disease called 'Diabetes' and the after effects of diabetes. Our Organisation is on a mission to spread awareness among young and old people about diabetes and generic medicines. Generic medicines are slowly reaching out to every lay man to lessen the burden of buying medicines at a greater cost. Now generic medicines are available at a greater discount price. This programme provides awareness on the benefits of generic medicines and health complications that leads to the disastrous end of human life. This awareness programme has impacted around 200 men and women



of various age groups in and around the operational blocks of the Organisation.

HIV/AIDS Awareness Programme



World AIDS day is commemorated on December 1st. Not only on this day, but every day the progress for an AIDS free nation is made into reality through the collective efforts of each individual and the community in general. Awareness programmes are carried out to the slums, public gatherings, bus stops etc and handbills are distributed to the public with the messages 'Zero AIDS' 'End HIV/AIDS'. The public/community has become more aware of the Pandemic. More than 600

people have been covered through this awareness programme.

POCSO Act Awareness

The pressing issue nation-wide that has to be dealt with immediately is safety and security to women and girl children. Almost one fourth of India's population is in the age group of 0-14 years and our country has one of the world's largest population of Children estimated at 444 million children. With each passing year, crimes against children are on the rise and still people are unaware that there is a law to address crimes against children, especially ones of sexual nature.

The Organisation has taken an initiative to provide awareness on POCSO Act. Being a pioneering initiative, the first awareness programme was carried out to the girl children of



Idigarai Government school. The session was through an audio-visual presentation where the children were given awareness on how to safeguard them in a desperate situation. The session proved to be an eye opener to the girl children, the Children opened up to the Co-ordinator and clarified questions. The presentation was followed by a Q & A session where the children had numerous questions that was clarified. Around 70 girl students benefited from the programme.

Homeless People - street dwellers

Yet another initiative of the Organisation was "Help the Homeless". The Organisation has identified and reached out to around 10 homeless elders who have been living by the roadside/platforms. These street dwellers were provided with basic necessities such as medical kit and hygiene kit which was much needed for them. As the next step, these homeless people will be directed to the Government run shelters.









CSR Flood Relief

As a part of CSR Initiative. Aishwariam NGO and Renovate India implemented HDFC Ergo's CSR Programme at Guindy, Chennai. The programme was to provide dry ration to 30 slum families who were affected by the recent floods in Chennai. The beneficiaries were identified on the basis of worst hit and affected by the floods, 30 families were shortlisted and grocery kit was sponsored to them. The staff had sponsored for the kits, it was distributed to the beneficiaries by them.





Organisational Development Programme

Aishwariam underwent a 15-month Organisational Development Programme sponsored by Dhwani Foundation, Bengaluru. The Programme was designed to enable Capacity Building for NGOs that have a lean operations team by engaging them at multiple levels while providing access to specialised service providers. This comprehensive capacity building programme lent support and training to implement 205 parameters across 8 important domains such as COMPLIANCE, GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP & STRATEGY, HUMAN RESOURCE, PROGRAMME MANAGEMENT, MIS & TECHNOLOGY, FUNDRAISING & MARKETING, ACCOUNTING & FINANCE. An assessment was done at the end of the programme on the 8 domain areas.

Events

Dental Camp

Aishwariam in association with Saravana Dental Hospital organised a one-day Dental Camp for the general public focussing on oral health and hygiene. An elaborate session on how to take care of the teeth and oral hygiene was much useful, the do's and don'ts of dental hygiene was an eye opener to the participants. Around 45 people participated in the Dental Camp and were benefitted.







Diwali - Light a Life

Celebrations are part of life which brings immense joy and happiness. To make Diwali 2023 special for PLHAs and their families, ASWO organised a one-day programme for them named 'Light a Life'. The Children and their parents were invited to ASWO office and were given new clothes which was handpicked by the Staff and Project Director for the auspicious day. This programme saw 50 families. The programme sponsors were invited as guests and the clothes were presented to each family by them. The Children and their families were overwhelmed by the kind gesture. The day ended with a special lunch and fireworks.







World Environment Day

World Environment Day was celebrated in a unique way where the women team of Aishwariam got an opportunity to celebrate it with an IT company organised by ConnectFor NGO. The women power or the change makers of the society were warmly received with refreshments and were headed to a session on 'Go Green - No Plastics'. The session was an engaging one with lot of reflections on Saving Environment and Greener Environment. The session also had a DIY component where the participants were given insights on recycling plastics into bird feeders. The participants had a fantastic day out with a lot of learnings on Environment and Nature.







Foundation Day

Foundation Day programme is celebrated every year with a view to celebrating the continued efforts and milestones achieved by the Organisation. In addition to this, to make the celebration even more meaningful, every year the Organisation provides free Tailoring course for 50 disadvantaged and deserving women. The Foundation Day training programme is a 2 month course in which they gain a thorough knowledge on both theory and practical. The trainees were given course completion certificates after the successful completion of the training programme. This training programme proved to be a milestone in their life in enhancing their economic stability, becoming self-reliant and sustainable.









Women's Day 2024

Every year International Women's Day is celebrated in a grand manner at Aishwariam. Admissions for Offer courses are announced prior to the programme, where 50 women are selected and offered tailoring course. Induction Programme for the new batch is done on this day and course completion certificates are given to the previous batch students. On this special day, motivational sessions, activities and games are conducted to create an air of fun, frolic and happiness. Special mentions and gifts are given to volunteers for their selfless contribution towards carrying out programmes at the Organisation.







International Yoga Day

Yoga promotes Physical and Mental health in every individual. Yoga exercises have shown significant benefits for physical and mental well-being. International Yoga Day is celebrated around the world annually on 21st June every year since 2014. As a part of creating awareness on Physical and Mental health, Yoga asanas and its benefits were elaborated to the Sanitation workers. This programme aimed at sensitising the beneficiaries to focus on facing challenges relating to health and healing. This programme had a greater impact amongst the participants. Around 20 people benefited from the programme.







Migratory Community (Nari Kurayargal)

The Narikuravar community is a marginalised and vulnerable group of people who face many challenges like low socio-economic statues, access to services, marginalisation, illiteracy, unemployment and cultural restrictions. No significant changes and improvements are seen in their community despite the Government's intervention in creating a Welfare Board for the Narikuravas in assimilating them into society. This community people want to lead a care free life and refuse to adhere to any norms. The Organisation has taken the initiative to bring about some kind of changes in their community. As a preview to that, a survey was done at Thuidyalur, Coimbatore North to understand livelihood engagements for them. At the end of the survey, new clothes were distributed to their families and children.

PoSH Awareness

The Organisation has signed an MoU with Dr. SNS Rajalakshmi College of Arts and Science. In connection to this, awareness programmes on PoSH (Prevention of |Sexual Abuse) and Women Empowerment were organised. These programmes aimed at sensitising young women about their rights and privileges. Students were given a thorough understanding on the following topics which created a great impact in their lives. The programme came to a close with a Question-and-Answer session where clarifications and discussions on the topics was held. Aound 150 students benefited from the programme.

Internships, Social Activities & NGO Observational visit

The Organisation accommodates students for Internships and Observational visits from Schools, Colleges and Universities every year. This year there were Interns from other states such as Kerala and Maharashtra. The Organisation has together accommodated a total of 50 numbers for Internship and Observational visits respectively. The Interns are given an orientation about the Organisation and the ongoing programmes/projects. They also participate in Community Development, Awareness programmes and Trainings that are carried out by the Organisation. Post graduate Students from Ramakrishna Engineering College, Coimbatore took part in an awareness programme where they performed a Street Play/Road show on HIV/AIDS for the public. These kind of participatory programmes and exposures not only add a feather on their cap in regard to their curriculum but also give an everlasting impact in building their overall persona. Every year the number of Students and Institutions increase. After the completion of Internship, they are provided with a certificate.

Fundraising with Annalect

As a part of a fundraising event, the Organisation was invited by Annalect, an IT firm to display the products made by the women self help groups of Aishwariam. Handmade thread bangles, home made chocolates, Jute bags were few of the stalls from the women self help groups.







Board Meeting

General body meeting and Board meetings were held on the scheduled dates. Polices (PoSH, CPP) Annual Budget, Financial report, Fundraising, Programme Planning & Implementation, Discussions on Challenges and Possibilities etc were the topics covered during the meetings.


